Edmonton Police Service NE Division and McLeod

Chris Nielsen, MLA hosted Ward 3 Councillor Jon Dziadyk and 4 officers from EPS Northeast Division, for an evening of questions and answers about community safety.

Councillor Dziadyk is asking the Transportation Department to make longer turn lights so people can get out of their neighbourhoods easier and make taking take the main roads like 153 Ave, 97 St and 82 St, an easy choice. That would reduce commuters driving through neighbourhoods.

Councillor Dziadyk is asking that 66 St from the Henday to 153 Ave be widened.

EPS Northeast Division has a dedicated traffic team in unmarked cars, focusing on speeding near schools, playgrounds, parks, and the Henday.

It is important to report all disturbances so that EPS know where to direct the officers in their daily briefing at the start of each shift. Your local knowledge helps them know where to deploying resources. It helps if you provide the time of day, location, frequency and type of problem behavior when you call. They are mapping all the complaints, so it is important to let them know, even if they can't respond quickly to your specific concern. It is important to call more than once if the problem is reoccurring.

On April 24th, the Edmonton-Decore Constituency Office organized a Town Hall meeting at Evansdale Community League with members of the Edmonton Police Service. In attendance and answering questions from the attendees were: MLA Chris Nielsen, Councillor Jon Dziadyk, Staff Sergeant David Goodkey, Sergeant Roger Bellerose, Constable Terry Cassells and Constable Myles Stomner. The event was well attended and there were numerous questions asked on a variety of subject areas including:

- Concerns about an unfinished road in the riding that was causing traffic to be re-routed through a residential area.
- Whether there is a plan for EPS to be at large bus stations, and whether there will be funding for this endeavor.
 - Speed in Eaux Claires
- Concerns about areas with poor lighting and how that was encouraging criminal activity.
 - Questions about theft and

robberies in the area.

- Concerns about the attempted abduction at Florence Hallock School.
- Ouestions about drug dealing in the area.
- Concerns about having an increased police presence in the area.
- Having license plates on both the front and the back of cars once again.
- Concerns surrounding how EPS handles domestic violence complaints.





Pets help us feel more connected, relaxed Pets can be the purr-fect therapist, offering nonjudgmental, unconditional love and support.

Animal-assisted therapy, and simply being with a pet regularly, has long been known to have mental health benefits.

Todd has been involved with the soccer program for many years and took up the reins in 2013. He has worked tirelessly to coordinate the army of volunteers it takes to run a soccer program of our size. Todd also works with the players, coaches, and parents to ensure that everyone is having fun. Ever the humble volunteer, Todd states "The soccer program wouldn't be the success it is without the huge commitment from all those involved, from the McLeod board, the Soccer Committee that I work so closely with, and the coaches who freely give their time teaching our community members about soccer." Not only is he rebuilding McLeod's softball program, he is representing McLeod at the Zone and city levels, and at Edmonton Youth Softball Association meetings. Richard has recognized his immediate predecessor Gord Matlock, a long serving volunteer at McLeod, by organizing a youth ball tournament in Gord's name, this spring. He collaborates with Ron, our baseball director in organizing ball registration and promptly answers parents' questions from Facebook and by email. Jason not only finds time out of his busy schedule to put together our newsletter submission, draft agendas and takes minutes for Board meetings, but he also helps out at many McLeod events. Jason is also the lead on the Matt Berry New Facility Committee which is a large project that requires expertise and coordination. McLeod is very fortunate to have someone like Jason on board.

McLeod Community League would like to recognize and thank Gerald Anderson for his help on many occasions last year when McLeod was in need of extra bingo and casino workers. Gerald volunteered freely without receiving anything in return and was happy to help the community league in this way. used every night and some nights there are back-to-back games on certain fields. Trash also attracts birds which compounds the problem. Teams shouldn't be expected to cleanup before they can play.

As the season is now underway, I remember conversations I had with parents and players during the soccer registration sessions. One common comment was they register for soccer to have fun. Let us talk about fun and how as parents we can promote fun.

Coaches can promote fun to a certain degree, but coaches cannot do it alone and we need parents to help achieve FUN. A recent study showed that one of the major reasons kids withdraw from sports is the fear of making mistakes, which leads to not having fun, and that usually comes from pressure. Let us picture this; a parent and child are getting ready to leave for a practice or a game, or in the car on the way to a game, a parent (with good intentions) might start a conversation to cover some of their child's supposed deficiencies and give them advice, or say something along the lines of "score a goal for me", "be the best". Kids who are talked to in this way, tend not to play badly, they just tend not to play, mostly to avoid making mistakes. So as parents let us help promote fun and this can start with saying the following 6 sentences before and after each practice or game:

Before:

I love you.

Good luck.

Have fun.

After:

I loved watching you play.

Did you have fun?

What do you want to eat?

Here are some tips to help keep you and others on the road safe!!

- · Leave adequate space between you and the vehicle in front of you
 - Be aware of what other drivers are doing
 - Know your unit's blind spots
 - Have your mirrors properly adjusted
- Ensure you are using your signal lights well ahead of your turn
- Complete proper pre and post trip inspec-
- Ensure your vehicle is properly main-
- Ensure you are getting any re-torques on tires completed with the distance advised
 - Do not overload your unit
- Ensure your unit gets its yearly inspection on time and the sticker is displayed with the copy of the inspection in the unit.

Parking Safety

Parking on/across sidewalks:

Please do not park on or across sidewalks at any time. This forces pedestrians including children or parents pushing strollers to have to go onto the roadway. The section that cover this under the City of Edmonton Traffic Bylaw #5590 is Part 2 Section 4. Ticket for this offense is a penalty of \$50.00 or it may be issued under the Alberta Use of Highway Rules and Regulations Section 44 (d) which carries a penalty of \$78.00. Your vehicle could be towed as well at your cost.

Unattached Trailers:

You are not permitted to leave your trailer unattached for any period of time on the roadway. The section that cover this under the City of Edmonton Traffic Bylaw #5590 is Section 20. Ticket for this offense is a penalty of \$50.00. Your trailer could be towed as well at your cost.

On another note please do not park you trailer on/across your sidewalk. You could be issued a ticket the same as a vehicle parked on or across the sidewalk as I have indicated above. Your trailer even though it is parked on your driveway can still be towed at your cost if it is on or across the sidewalk.
