It's all part of the 19th Eco-Solar Home tour that happens for the entire June 2nd/3rd weekend all around Edmonton. All of the homes, churches, and buildings are solar-powered and many are net-zero, which means they produce all of buildings energy needs from a solar system on site. See www.ecosolar.ca for details.

Evansdale Community League was the first hall in Edmonton entirely powered by solar energy on a netannual basis. The hall has a 26.3 kilowatt solar system that consists of 100 solar modules that will provide our electricity for more than 25 years.

Evansdale is also undergoing a comprehensive energy retrofit. The league is replacing all of its 40-year-old lighting systems with LED lights. We have already replaced our rink lights and parking lot lights with LEDs as well. We're replacing our furnaces and water heater with energy efficient models and we're adding energy saving smart thermostats, so we can program energy efficiency into our operations.

Fun for kids, learn about solar and energy efficiency

Everyone is welcome to our Evansdale Family Solar Fun Dav. We will have a jumpy arena and face painting for the kids and MLA Chris Nielsen is again sponsoring a solar-themed colouring contest with prizes for the kids. You must be in attendance to win!

We will have energy efficiency and solar companies there such as Evergreen and Gold Renewable Energy (the company that installed our solar system) and Generate Energy, a company that does energy audits and energy efficiency and solar projects.

We will have electric cars such as Teslas and Nissan Leafs on hand with their owners, so you can check out the latest electric cars.

Ron Kube, the guy who was dubbed The Energy Detective, will be there. You can learn how Ron calculated that he had enough surplus solar energy to drive his Nissan Leaf for 20,000 km a

Paying attention to fatigue

Many of us feel fatigued at one time or another, but fatigue can sometimes mean more is happening with your body.

Fatigue can often be the result of overwork, poor sleep, worry, boredom, or a lack of exercise. People who have anxiety or depression may also experience fatigue. It can also be a symptom caused by illness, medication, or medical treatment such as chemotherapy.

Fatigue brought on by over work or illnesses such as colds or flus often resolves itself on its own without having to see a doctor. However, if you are experiencing fatigue that lasts longer than two weeks, it may be a symptom of a more serious health problem and a trip to the doctor may be required:

Anemia – a decrease in the amount of hemoglobin (oxygen-carrying substance) found in the red blood cells

Heart problems, including coronary artery disease or heart failure, that limit the supply of oxygen-rich blood to the heart or the rest of the body

Metabolic disorders, including diabetes

Thyroid issues – both hypothyroidism (low thyroid level) and hyperthyroidism (high thyroid level) can cause fatigue

Kidney or liver disease

Check your symptoms to help determine if and when your fatigue may require a visit to your doctor. Learn more about fatigue on My-HealthAlberta.

Ask Charles

There was a major hail storm after a seller accepted my offer to purchase their home, and the house needs a new roof. Who is responsible for it?

Until the deal closes and you take possession of the property, the seller is responsible for the property. Any damage to the property or to the items included in the sale, are the sole responsibility of the seller until your purchase funds are transferred and you take possession of the home.

When you take possession, the property – and its inclusions (appliances, etc.) – should be in the same condition as when you viewed it and submitted your offer to purchase.

Even if the property is vacant, and has been for weeks, it is still the seller's responsibility to maintain home insurance on the property.

As the buyer, you should make sure you arrange for your home insurance to begin on your possession day, even if you aren't moving in right away. As soon as you take possession, insuring the property is your responsibility.

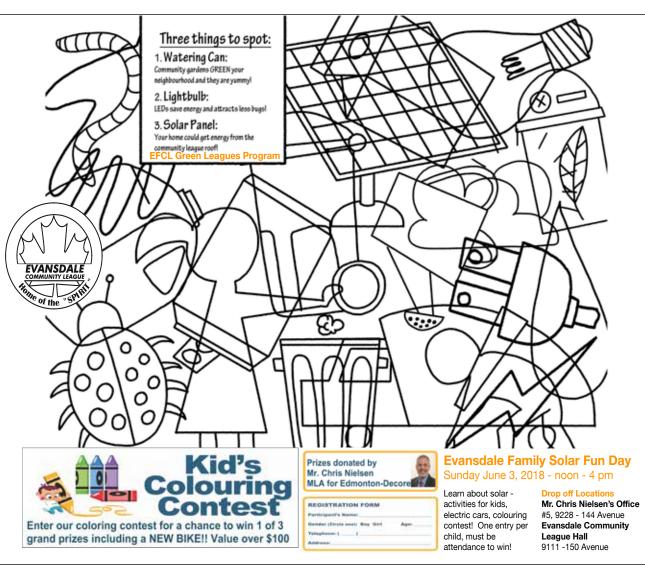
If something such as a hail storm damages the property in the time between the seller accepting your offer and possession day, have your agent talk to the seller's agent to confirm the seller is handling the damage. If the seller confirms they're handling the repairs, you may wish to add an addendum to your accepted offer to purchase that outlines the seller's responsibility to replace the roof prior to possession day, or you may ask

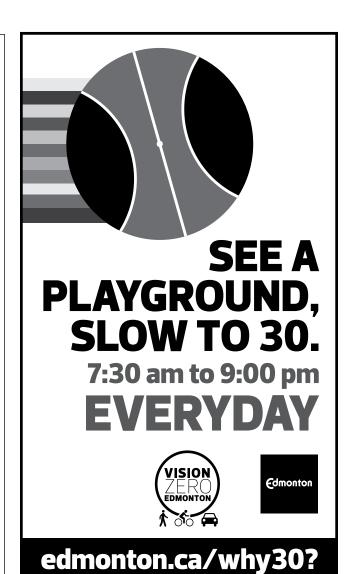
the seller to agree to you holding back a small portion of the purchase funds until the roof is repaired. Make sure any agreements between you and the seller are in writing.

If there is any resistance on the part of the seller, either to fixing the damage or to putting details and agreements in writing, you need to talk to a lawyer for legal advice.

Likewise, if either party wishes to end the transaction in light of the damage done to the property, or if the seller refuses to repair the roof prior to possession, contact a lawyer for legal advice.

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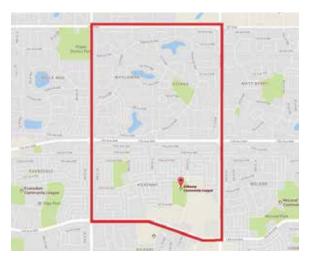

Backyard Safety Manage the risks

During the summer months, children spend countless hours playing in their backyards. There are many potential hazards in the backyard that can result in injuries. Protect your children by managing the risks.

Survey the Yard

Make sure all fence gates are selfclosing and self-latching.

Have afence separate the play area from the driveway and garage.

Lawn Sprinklers/Water Slides

Use only on grass.

Make sure the area is free of obstacles and debris.

Teach children to slide sitting up and not to walk or run on water slides.

Sandboxes

Check sandboxes regularly to make sure they are in good repair, with no protruding nails or splintered wood.

A sandbox cover is recommended, especially if pets roam freely in your neighbourhood.

Dog Bites

Do not leave children alone and unsupervised with dogs.

Teach children not to tease strike any dog and to be cautious around unfamiliar dogs.

Teach children not to disturb dogs, especially when they are sleeping, eating or caring for puppies.

Teach children not to take toys, sticks or food from a dog.

Play Equipment

Actively supervise all young children. Remove drawstrings and scarves from children's clothing.

Properly secure equipment to the ground.

Set up backyard swings and other play equipment on a shock-absorbing surface (i.e. sand, wood chips or pea gravel).

Put railings around all decks that are more than one metre off the ground.

Limit height of the equipment

less than 1.8 m (6 ft). Check equipment for gaps, worn, loose or broken parts.

Teach children the basic rules of safe play.

Always wear shoes.

Remove bike helmets when on equip-

Slide down feet first and sitting up. One person on the slide at a time.

No pushing or horseplay on play equipment.

Wait your turn.

Hold on with both hands when swinging and climbing.

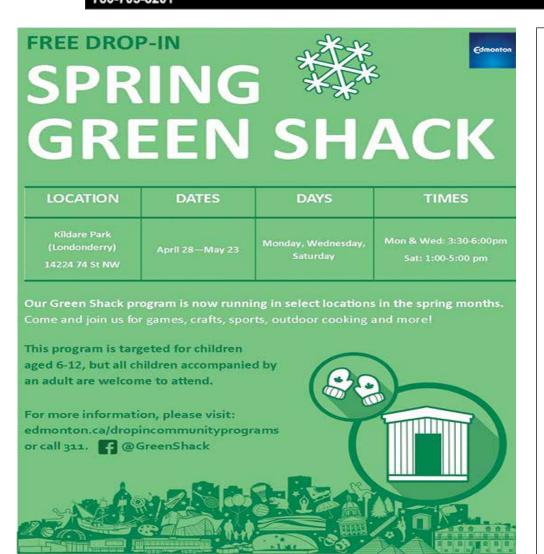

I have reached out to the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues and Councillor Paquette's office for assistance with next steps. It seems that Citizen Services has forgotten the significant and historic role that community leagues played in establishing the City's Recreation Commission in 1944. Fortunately, we haven't.

McLeod Community Safety Director

In the month of May, the Alberta Traffic Safety Calendar primary focus is Motorcycle Safety. Spring will finally be upon us and motorcycles will be coming out of their storage locations.

Motorcycle operators need to be cautious, with some roads having sand and gravel not removed from the winter season. Motorcycle operators also need to be aware that other drivers of the roads may not be aware they are back on the road. Motorcycle operators need to be more alert to this.

Here are some tips to ensure your bike is safe to ride:

Check your lights

Check your tire pressures

Check to ensure your brakes are working

Check for fluid leaks

If you're not mechanically inclined I would

suggest having the bike transported to a certified mechanic to inspect.

Additionally, ensure your registration and insurance is current and copies are with you on your person or stored inside the bike.

We as drivers can help ensure motorcycle operators stay safe. I ask that you take an extra moment when changing lanes or turning at intersections to look for motorcycles that may be approaching.

Stranger Danger

Stranger Danger is something I strongly believe in. Parents/Guardians – you are responsible to speak to their children about Stranger Danger to help ensure their safety. Here are some safety tips on Stranger Danger.

Avoid putting your child's name on their backpack, lunch boxes, bracelets, tags or anything which makes their name highly visible to strangers. Children are more likely to trust a stranger that knows their name

Make up a family secret code and/or speak to your children who is allowed to pick them up

Explain to them to never approach a vehicle or stranger even if they are trying to persuade them with candy or toys

Explain to them if a stranger grabs them to do everything you can to stop him or her from pulling them away. Drop to the ground, kick, hit, bite, and scream. Do whatever it takes to attract the attention of others who can help them. Tell them to scream, "this is not my dad," or "this is not my mom."

Explain to them when trying to find help to always go to a trusted adult – teacher, principal,coach, police officer, other parent, or older siblings.

What am I am about to say sounds like common sense but happens over and over. Please never leave children unattended in your vehicle. Criminals look for easy opportunities and if you give them one you may regret it if your vehicle is stolen with your children still inside, your children are taken, injured or harmed.

If you see children left unattended in a vehicle please take down as much information as possible including description of the children and description of the vehicle (make, model, color, license plate number including province where issued) and call 911. If you can, and feel safe, stay on location until the police or the parents/guardian arrive. If the parents/guardians arrive at the vehicle before police please do not confront. Provide the police with the last direction of travel which still gives the police an opportunity to stop the vehicle.

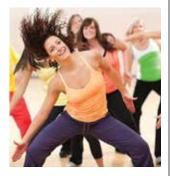

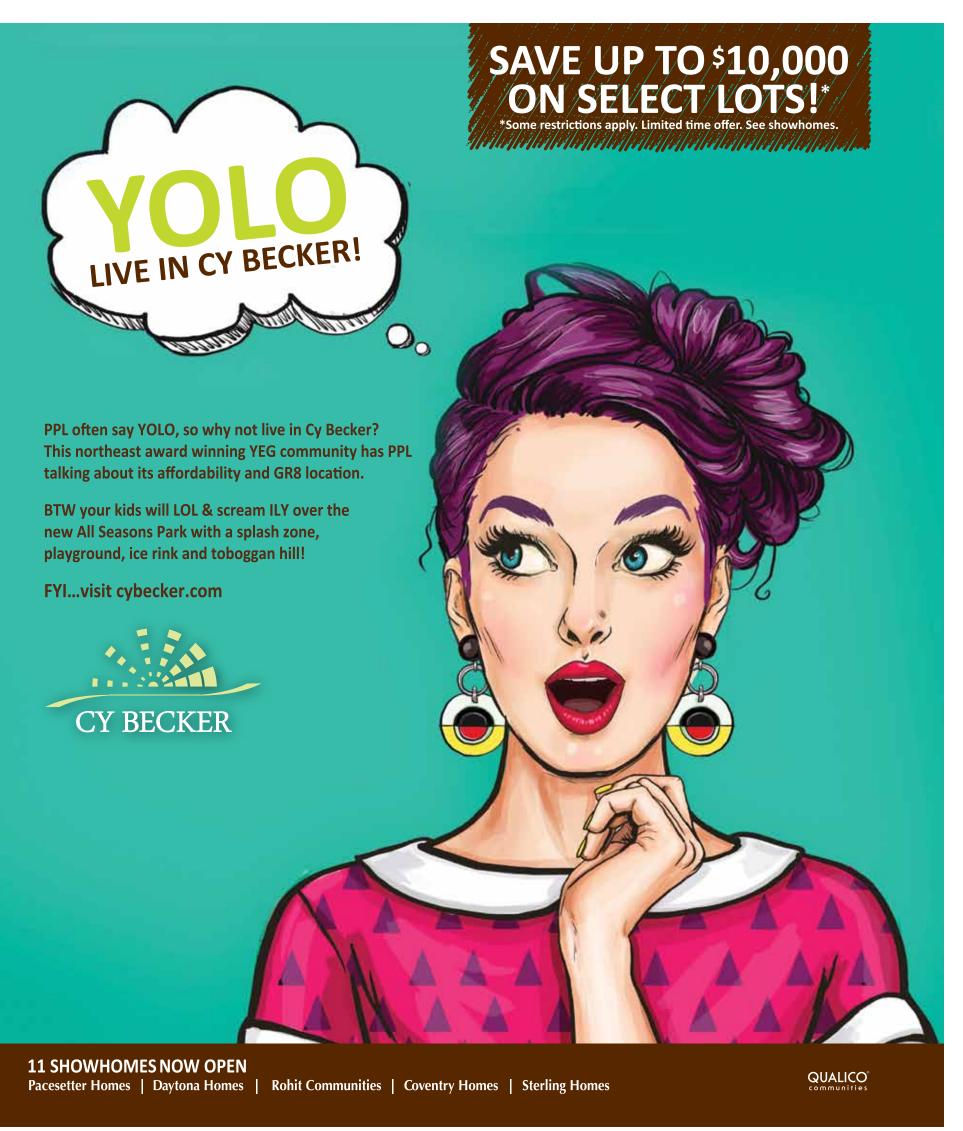
