

NEW PLAYGROUND DEVELOPMENT

The City of Edmonton has chosen the Baturyn community to use infrastructure funding to invest in our community's City-owned playground infrastructure.

This is outside of the City's regular Neighbourhood Park Development Program (NPDP), which commonly focuses on playground renewal.



What Does This Mean To Your Neighbourhood?

The playground at 10505 172 Avenue NW will be replaced with a NEW PLAYGROUND in 2021! The scope of this renewal will include new playground equipment and safety surfacing at the site at no cost to the Community. Construction on both playground pods is planned for spring/summer 2021 with a target completion of fall 2021.

The Baturyn Playground Committee will

continue meeting on a regular basis to develop equipment (such as seating and shade) in the area surrounding the playground equipment. If you are interested in becoming involved, all are welcome. 



New beginnings and new opportunities in Ward 72

As the earth tilts towards the sun the days become longer and warmer, and we look forward to all the glorious natural events and warm feelings that spring ushers in. Students will be enjoying their annual ritual - Spring Break! Spring break provides a wonderful opportunity for families and our staff to rejuvenate and spend time with loved ones. Students will be dismissed for Spring Break on Friday, March 26th. Classes will resume on Tuesday, April 6th.

This is also the time we Catholics prepare our hearts for the Tridium and are reminded that in the midst of our struggles through the pandemic that a bright light is shining in the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is in this light that we rest our hope that God is always with us. I wish you and your family a blessed Easter!

On March 10, the provincial government announced the 2021 Capital Plan. Edmonton Catholic School Division (ECSD) was heartened to learn the 2021 Alberta provincial budget allocated \$268M for school construction. As part of that announcement, ECSD is especially pleased that funding has been provided for a new Catholic high school in north Edmonton.

Our Division is pleased that the provincial government acknowledged the critical need for our first Capital Plan priority of a new high school in Castle Downs/Dunluce. We are grateful to the Alberta Government in addressing our advocacy to support the needs of our students and community. Nearly 1,400 high school students reside in north Edmonton with no school option within their community. A new high school will also ease enrolment pressure at Archbishop O'Leary which is currently at a utilization rate of 116%.

The Board of Trustees is committed to ongoing interaction with our stakeholders. The Board hosted a virtual Division-wide parent engagement evening in March. School council executive members were invited to join their Ward Trustee representative to learn about the four Board priorities for the upcoming year, which includes the following: Growing in Faith, Student Success, An Excellent Place to Work and Learn, and Building Our Future Together. Parents were provided an opportunity to share their ideas and insights on these initiatives, which are important in planning for how these priorities will be brought to life in our schools.

Engaging student voices in a meaningful way is another key in promoting and

advancing Catholic education at ECSD. Student representatives from our high schools met virtually with the Board four times this year. They provided their perspective on topics such as: what supports are important in school, faith in a digital world, ways to strengthen partnerships

between school staff, students, and parents, and much more. We are grateful for these discussions and look forward to continuing our conversations in the Fall.

The ECSD Learning Services Department presented its long-standing Spring into Art exhibition though a virtual art gallery on the ECSD website. Students from 100 Voices through to Grade 12 showcased their artistic gifts and talents with our Catholic community through the gallery, which featured over 400 pieces of artwork.

In closing, I want to take the opportunity to share my appreciation for the outstanding dedication of our staff, students, and families for being incredible stewards and ambassadors of our Division during these extraordinary times. I welcome the opportunity to engage with our school communities as I am committed to making decisions that are in the best interests of our students and ensuring the well-being of our Division is at the forefront of all that we do!

Gibran Khalil Gibran - Park

Edmonton joins other major cities around the world in having a park named for world renowned Author, Poet and Inspiring Humanist, Gibran Khalil Gibran.

Gibran migrated to USA with his family in the early part of Twentieth Century from modern-day Lebanon, along with many people from the Levant who settled in USA, Canada and South America.

Gibran is an icon of pride for Lebanon and for all countries of the Arab World. His books in both Arabic and English Languages are admired and cherished by all. His book, The Prophet, was translated into more than 50 languages and has sold millions of copies.

Gibran 'B's books, paintings and articles made him a spiritually unifying figure and a point of pride for Canadians and many people around the world.

The park is located in the neighborhood of Beaumaris and officially became known as **S**dmonton Gibran Khalil Gibran Parkâ when the municipal Naming Committee endorsed the proposal by the local Gibran Khalil Gibran Foundation, earlier this week. There is a sizeable Middle Eastern population in North Edmonton, particularly in Beaumaris, part of Castle Downs, and many wanted a place named after a cultural icon. Community members engaged with the local city councillor, Jon Dziadyk to explore the possibilities.

The Gibran Khalil Gibran Foundation core committee is chaired by Mr. Joe Hak, and the membership includes Hussein Rahall, Honor-

ary Lebanese Consul; Samir Bleibel, President of the World Lebanese Cultural Union & Edmonton Chapter; Yazen Haymour, President of the Canadian Arab Friendship Association; and City Councillor Jon Dziadyk is an honorary member and advocate.

Joe Hak, Foundation Chair, said: **&**ibran Khalil Gibran embodies the Spiritual Unity of all Lebanese, in Lebanon and all over the world. His gifted mind and soul roamed the universe and reached the highest of Holy Virtues of all human beings!**â**

Jon Dziadyk, City Councillors, said: **ā**his park is the work of great community leaders coming together and it honours a unifying figure of great literary importance. It is a welcomed addition to the community.**â**

The renamed park is 1.3 acres and located at 15605 - 106 Street, adjacent to picturesque Beaumaris Lake. With the name now official, the Foundation will begin fundraising to landscape the park in a manner appropriate for Gibran. Announcements for abbon-cutting and unveiling will be made when circumstances permit. The Foundation hopes to establish a place of quiet reflection, celebration, and to inspire youth to become familiar with the great works of Gibran.

The park renaming comes at a time when the whole neighborhood is getting reconstructed, and will surely become a welcoming place for years to come. Other cities with parks named in Gibran handle should be home. Boston, Vancouver and Montreal.

New germ-killing LRT seats

Over the past year, Edmonton Transit Service (ETS) has implemented over 30 different public health measures to help stop the spread of COVID-19 and help keep transit riders safe and healthy on the transit system. One of our latest public health enhancements is the installation of new germ-killing seats on approximately two-thirds of Edmonton's LRT fleet (the newer LRT cars).

A germ-killing additive has been incorporated directly into the seat plastic and can reduce up to 99.9 per cent of germs (i.e. bacteria, fungus and viruses). The seats will also be easier to clean and maintain, and are expected to last the remaining life of the LRT cars.

"Health and safety continues to be our primary focus, and these new germ-killing LRT seats complement all of the other public health measures we have in place, like enhanced daily cleaning and disinfecting of transit vehicles and transit property," said Craig McKeown, Director, LRT Operations and Maintenance, ETS. "We're continually looking to incorporate innovative health measures to keep Edmontonians safe."

Funding for the new LRT seats largely came from other orders of government, most nota-

bly from the Public Transit Infrastructure Fund (PTIF).

Outbreaker Solutions pilot project update


This past January, ETS and a local biotechnology company, Outbreaker Solutions, began a pilot project involving the installation of germ-killing push-plates on entrance and exit manual swing doors at some LRT stations and transit centres. To date, push-plates have been installed on doors at Bay/Enterprise, Central, University, Health Sciences/Jubilee and Southgate stations. This pilot project is at no cost to taxpayers, and will continue until this summer when results will be evaluated.

Edmontonians should still continue to follow all COVID-19 related safety precautions, including practicing good hand hygiene before and after using transit, physical distancing when possible, as well as wearing a mask or face covering on transit and at transit facilities.

The risk of COVID-19 transmission on public transit continues to be low, and we'd like to thank Edmontonians for continuing to wear a mask and complying with public health guidelines.



Update your immunizations



April 24 to 30 is National Immunization Awareness Week.

When was the last time you updated your immunizations? If you can't remember, it may be time to get them done. It is recommended that adults in Alberta receive:

- A booster dose of tetanus / diphtheria vaccine every 10 years
- An adult booster dose of pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine, combined with one of the tetanus / diphtheria boosters (dTap)
- The dTap vaccine for pregnant women every time they are pregnant
- Hepatitis B vaccine for unprotected adults born in 1981 or later. Some adults born before 1981 may need this vaccine if they are at risk for hepatitis B (e.g. health problems, type of work, lifestyle, contact with the virus)
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) vaccine for adults whose immunization records do not show the recommended number of doses of

measles, mumps, or rubella vaccine.

- Chickenpox vaccine for unprotected adults
- Annual influenza vaccine for all Albertans
 6 months of age and older
- Pneumococcal vaccine for all adults 65 years of age and older and adults with certain health problems.

To find out which vaccines are recommended for you and to book an appointment for immunization, call your nearest community health centre or public health centre. If you are not sure where your nearest community health centre or public health centre is, you can call Health Link at 811. Bring any immunization records you have to the appointment, especially if you were immunized in another province or country.



Help for a common skin disease

April is Rosacea Awareness Month.

Rosacea (say "roh-ZAY-shuh") is a common skin disease that affects people over the age of 30. It causes redness on your nose, cheeks, chin, and forehead. Some people get little bumps and pimples on the red parts of their faces. Rosacea can also cause burning and soreness in your eyes.

If your rosacea bothers you or has gotten worse, talk to your doctor. Getting treatment can help your skin look and feel better. And it may keep your rosacea from getting worse.

Rosacea often flares when something causes the blood vessels in the face to expand, which causes redness. Common triggers are exercise, sun and wind exposure, hot weather, stress, spicy foods, alcohol, and hot baths. Swings in temperature from hot to cold or cold to hot can also cause a flare-up. Rosacea is not caused by heavy alcohol use, as people thought in the past. But in people who have rosacea, drinking alcohol may cause symptoms to get worse.

What are the symptoms?

People with rosacea may have:

- A flushed, red face with sensitive, dry skin that may burn or sting.
- Small bumps and pimples or acne-like breakouts.
- Skin that gets coarser and thicker, with a bumpy texture.
 - Dry, red, irritated eyes.
- In rare cases, untreated rosacea may cause permanent thickening of the skin on

your face or loss of vision. Most cases don't progress this far.

How is it treated?

There is no cure, but with treatment, most people can control their symptoms and keep the disease from getting worse.

Learn what triggers your flare-ups. It can help to keep a diary of what you were eating, drinking, and doing on days that the rosacea appeared. Take the diary to your next doctor visit, and discuss what you can do to help control the disease.

Your family doctor or a dermatologist can also prescribe treatments to reduce redness and breakouts.

Redness and breakouts can be treated with: • Pills, such as low-dose antibiotics like

- doxycycline.
- Skin creams that contain medicine, such as azelaic acid or metronizadole.

Redness from tiny blood vessels can be treated with lasers and another light treatment called intense pulsed light (IPL).

Dry, sensitive skin can be protected with products for sensitive skin, such as moisturizers and sunscreen. Stay out of the sun between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. When you are outdoors, protect your face by wearing a widebrimmed hat or visor. Use a sunscreen that is rated SPF 30 or higher every day. If your skin is dry, find a moisturizer with sunscreen.

Dry, red, and irritated eyes can be treated with artificial tears or prescription evedrops that contain a medicine such as cyclosporine.

Start The Street Sweeping!



The City of Edmonton will start citywide street sweeping on April 6, weather permitting.

"We remind Edmontonians to help do their part by removing their vehicles and providing our crews plenty of room to work," said Andrew Grant, General Supervisor for Infrastructure Field Operations. "We ask that they watch for signage in their neighbourhoods to know when crews will be on their streets. This ensures our crews are able to deliver a high level of service and clear streets quickly and efficiently."

Street sweeping will run Monday to Friday, 24 hours a day. The City's sweeping process is as efficient and non-disruptive as possible. Parks crews will sweep boulevards and push debris onto roads. Road crews will sweep up debris on residential roads during the day and on high-volume roads during the night. Motorists can expect to see peace officers, flashing

lights and blocked lanes on high-volume and high-speed roads.

Residents can support the spring sweep program by moving their vehicles when crews are in their neighbourhood. Vehicles left on neighbourhood roads may receive a courtesy tow to a nearby road but will not be ticketed. In areas where there are too many vehicles parked on the road, crews will bypass that

Sweeping schedules will be posted on neighbourhood signs and on edmonton.ca/ streetsweeping. Schedules will be updated regularly throughout the next seven to eight weeks. While each neighbourhood has a designated week for residential sweeping, residents may see crews early if they are ahead of schedule.


