The Great Pallet Parade

Teams will build and decorate a pallet. They will then push, pull, drag this sled along a path. Think of a one-at-a-time parade. The big idea is to get people to work together and be outside doing something pretty stupid...uh we mean fun.

The rules will be:

- Each sled must be built on a standard wooden pallet (40" x 48"ish). Up to three pallets may be used as a base.
- The pallet may have devices attached below to help it slide over the snow.
- The ratio of riders to propellers cannot exceed five propellers (yes that is a real word) for every one rider. (You can't have one rider and six people pulling).
- The sled must be able to be propelled a distance of 47 big steps.
- It must be people powered only. NO engines, NO dog teams, NO cats. The pallet may not be higher than 15 cm above the ground.
- The total sled (including riders) must not weigh more than six African elephants.
- The maximum height is 68 meters. Maximum width is 3 meters. Maximum length is 7.589 meters. If you meet any of these we will be astonished.
- All participants will sign a waiver acknowledging that they are aware that this is stupid and impending death is highly likely.

Baturyn Neighbourhood Renewal

Starting in 2023, Baturyn will see the replacement of its roads and alleys, street lights, sidewalks and curbs as part of the City of Edmonton's Building Great Neighbourhoods program. We have also explored other opportunities to improve how people walk, bike, drive and roll in the neighbourhood, as well as potential improvements to parks and open spaces.

We appreciate everyone who took the time to complete the online surveys, attend virtual events or reach out to the project team over the past year.

In 2021, we:

- + engaged digitally and completed two project phases: **Exploring Options and Tradeoffs** and **Community Feedback on Draft Design**
- + had over **1000** questions, ideas and comments submitted
- + gathered feedback through **212** completed online surveys
- + saw **4125** visits to edmonton.ca/BuildingBaturyn
- + had over **900** views of the project designs

The feedback you provided last November during the **Community Feedback on Draft Design** phase is now being considered to help us **REFINE** the designs for Baturyn. We are reviewing and considering your feedback, along with technical requirements and City programs and policies, to complete the final design.

Materials and reports completed to date, can be viewed through the project webpage at edmonton.ca/BuildingBaturyn.

During the next phase of engagement, **Community Feedback on Final Design**, we will ask residents to **ADVISE** us with any new information and if the final design reflects Baturyn's Vision and Guiding Principles. New beginnings and new opportunities in Ward 72

Edmonton Catholic Schools Trustee Sandra Palazzo

The start of a new year gives us a renewed sense of optimism, and the confidence to look forward to celebrating the successes of our students throughout the coming months with joy.

ECSD was pleased to welcome students back to in-person learning after the extended Christmas break. Our Division and staff continue to do everything feasible to maintain safe and healthy learning and work environments in the face of a constantly changing landscape during the ongoing public health crisis. We applaud the Division's updated Back-To-School Plan, which includes the enhancement of ventilation systems. To further support high school students whose learning was disrupted by the extended break, the Government of Alberta announced that the January diploma exams have been cancelled. A decision regarding the April and June diploma exams will be made by Alberta Education later in 2022.

The Board continues to communicate and meet regularly with government to raise awareness of the needs of our students, staff and Division. Some of this year's advocacy priorities relate to the needed supports for student learning and investment in learning environments including restored funding for pre-kindergarten and 4th and 5th year high school students; continued or increased funding for pandemic recovery and specialized services; faster access for students to access mental health and crisis care; and continued review and rigorous revision of the new curriculum, and opportunities for students to access post-secondary pathways. We also continue to advocate for the funding of new schools and modulars, major modernizations of older schools, and for new and upgraded outdoor play spaces and playgrounds.

Edmonton Catholic Schools is looking ahead to the 2022-23 school year and pre-



paring for the upcoming academic year. Each school will be hosting virtual open house sessions to inform students and families about their school and the programs they offer. The session will assist students in making appropriate educational decisions based on personal goals. Please check www.ecsd.net to locate schools of interest and the dates for open house sessions. Additionally, our schools will be accepting registrations online again this year. If you are new to Edmonton Catholic Schools, please visit register.ecsd.net to find your school and follow the steps to register.

We recognize that everyone plays an important role towards maintaining the safety of our schools while striving to achieve and exceed the expected level of educational success. We are proud for the faith, resilience, patience and support of all our students, families, administration and staff.

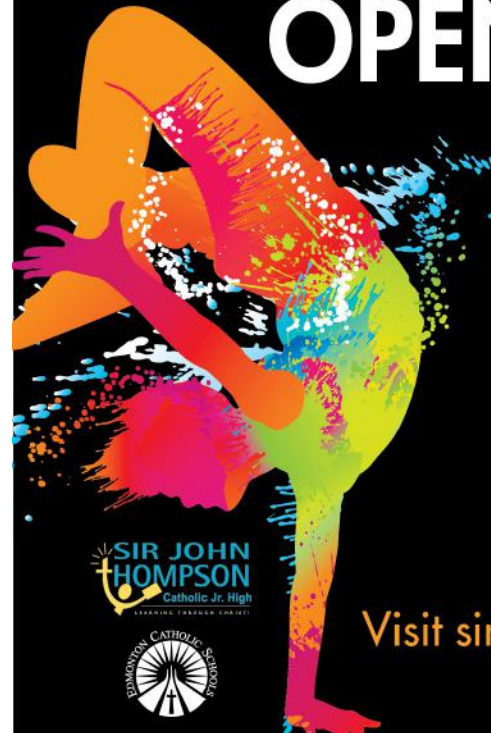

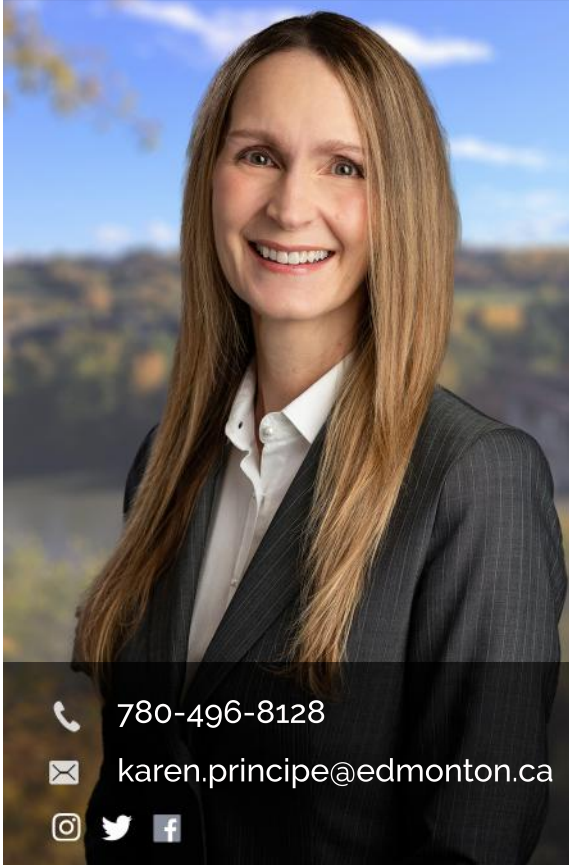
