**Community League Day** 

As organizations, Edmonton's Community Leagues aren't really ones to draw attention to themselves. Leagues and the people who run them are all about supporting others. Whether it's maintaining the neighbourhood rink that welcomes everyone with a pair of skates — and has some you can borrow if you need — or giving local greenthumbs a place to swap seeds and stories, Leagues are fulfilling their highest purpose when they're allowing people to reach higher, see further, and do more than they would alone.

So it shouldn't be any surprise that Community League Day, which takes place this year on September 21, is less about patting on the back and more about shaking hands and seeing new faces. Though the parties themselves are as diverse as the people that plan them and the neighbourhoods they take place in, every celebration is ultimately about the one thing that's at the heart of everything a Community League does: bringing people together.

"We always have some amazing and creative people at our Leagues who come up with ways to get their community engaged, but whether it's a sports tournament or celebrating a hall renovation or just eating together, it's the conversations that happen in between everything that really make the day worthwhile," explains Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues (EFCL) Executive Director Laura Cunningham-Shpeley. As the umbrella organization for Edmonton's 163 Community Leagues, the EFCL helps support the dozens of parties that take place on Community League Day. "Neighbours make neighbourhoods, and making good neighbours so often starts with just getting out in the community and having a great experience together."

Though the Community League movement has more than a century of history in Edmonton, the idea of setting aside a day just to celebrate the work of Leagues is a relatively recent invention — albeit one inspired by that history. Organizing city-wide events has almost always been a function



of the EFCL: beginning with amateur sports tournaments in the 1930s, it extended everywhere from beauty pageants, to soap box races and even Community League parades in the heydays of the 1950s and '60s. Over the years, though, much of that had fallen by the wayside, either because the events grew enough to be taken over by dedicated organizations or, as some at the time argued, the community spirit just wasn't what it used to be.

Enter Community League Day in 2006. Combining the best of the neighbourhood-driven ethos that has made Leagues such an integral part of their communities with Edmonton's well-known love of a city-wide celebration, the Day was designed to remind us that even when we're in different corners of the city, ultimately we're all still in this together. As it's grown into a staple of the city calendar — and the most important membership drive for Leagues city-wide — it's become proof that coming together never really goes out of style.

"We have had mayors come out of the Community League movement, councillors, MLAs and a whole lot of community builders of all stripes, and they all started that journey just by getting to know the people who lived in their community," says Cunningham-Shpeley. "There's so much we can accomplish just by meeting each other and having some fun together."



#### All about low blood pressure

Blood pressure is a measure of how hard blood pushes against the walls of your arteries as it moves through your body. Low blood pressure means that your blood pressure is lower than normal. It's also called hypotension.

In healthy adults, low blood pressure may not cause problems or symptoms. In fact, it may be normal for you. But if your blood pressure drops suddenly or causes symptoms like dizziness or fainting, it is too low.

In general, low blood pressure symptoms happen when blood pressure is less than 90/60.

#### The causes of low blood pressure

Often people learn that they have low blood pressure when their doctor checks it. Or you may find that you have low blood pressure when you check it at home. To check for the causes of your low blood pressure, your doctor will ask about your past health, your symptoms, and the medicines you take. You will have a physical exam, and other tests may be done. Your doctor may check for another health problem that could

be causing your low blood pressure.

Some causes of low blood pressure include:

- · Getting up quickly after you sit or lie down. This can cause a quick drop in blood pressure called orthostatic hypotension.
- Standing for a long time.
- Not drinking enough fluids (dehydration).
- · Medicines. Examples are high blood pressure medicine or other heart medicines.
- · Health problems. Examples are thyroid disease, severe infection, and neuropathy.
- Trauma, Examples are major bleeding and bad burns.

#### Symptoms of low blood pressure

Many people with low blood pressure don't have any symptoms. Symptoms to watch for include:

- Feeling dizzy, light-headed, or faint.
- Feeling sick to your stomach or vomiting.

If you have symptoms of low blood pressure, especially dizziness or fainting, call your doctor. Watch for symptoms of low blood pressure. Tell your doctor when the symptoms happen so they can be treated.

#### Vending machines and healthy food choices

From going to work, attending school, or running errands, having a busy schedule can lead to eating more meals and snacks away from home. Foods eaten out of the house may include homemade dishes and snacks brought from home, or foods purchased from places like vending machines, convenience stores, cafes, and restaurants.

Often many of the foods prepared in restaurants and cafes or packaged foods like those found in vending machines contain higher amounts of salt (sodium), fat (saturated), and added sugars. Consuming these types of foods frequently and in large amounts may increase your risk of developing health conditions such as hypertension (high blood pressure), Type 2 Diabetes and heart disease.

Planning ahead and being prepared for the days when you know you will be eating outside of the house can help support a healthy



eating pattern. If you can, bring a packed meal from home and try to have easy and nutritious snacks on hand such as vegetable sticks with hummus or No Bake Trail Mix. For these and other healthy snack recipes, visit ahs.ca/recipes and search 'snacks'.

We know sometimes it is not possible to bring snacks and meals from home. However, it is important to make sure you are eating and staying hydrated throughout the day to keep your body energized. To provide food options for many workplaces, schools, and recreational facilities will have food and beverages available to buy from vending machines or concession stands.



## Back to school safety



Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and students of safety tips as the school year begins again this fall. Pedestrians and motorists both have a key role to play – road safety is a shared responsibility.

#### **Motorists**

- Distracted driving carries a \$300 fine and three demerit points in Alberta. Avoid the use of mobile devices or engaging in any other behavior that diverts your attention away from driving:
- Give right-of-way to pedestrians who have activated overhead crossing lights, or who are waiting to cross from a street corner;
- Other than parked cars, it is illegal to pass another vehicle in a school or playground zone during posted hours

#### **Around school buses**

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is slowing down to stop – motorists should do likewise;
- No matter which direction you are coming from, STOP when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights – unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you;
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.


#### **Pedestrians**

- Cross only at marked crosswalks, or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions;
- Make eye contact with all drivers before crossing the street, and keep distractions to a minimum;
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause before stepping off the curb to ensure motorists in both directions have come to a complete stop:
- Stay within the crosswalk lines;
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the 'walk' sign and only when all vehicles have come to a complete stop;
- If you are with young children or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when crossing;
- Remember: children learn by observing. By demonstrating safe crossing habits, you can reduce the chances of your child being involved in a preventable auto/pedestrian collision.

# Taking charge of proper lithium ion battery and electronic (e-waste) disposal



No matter how small, lithium ion batteries and e-waste present a growing safety risk when not disposed of properly.

The City urges residents to take charge and properly dispose of batteries and electronic waste, including vape pens, tablets or computers, power tools, toys and anything else that can be recharged or has an internal lithium ion battery. These items can be taken to an Eco Station or dropped off at a number of local retailers across the City for free.

Lithium ion batteries, on their own or as internal components in e-waste, can expand, ignite and explode during waste processing. As electronic devices have become more common, there is an increase in e-waste and battery-related fires at City waste facilities, which put staff and facilities at significant risk.

E-waste goes well beyond the classic AA and AAA batteries used in remotes, electronics and toys. If it makes noise, lights up, connects to the Internet or it is plugged in to charge, it contains an internal battery and needs to be disposed of with caution.

Some other common

items that have internal batteries are:

Vaporizers, vape pens and e-cigarettes

E-scooters, E-bikes or any battery operated mobility device

Wireless headphones, earbuds or portable speakers

Handheld kitchen appliances (mixers, inversion blenders, frothers)

Smartwatches and fitness trackers

Digital cameras and camcorders

Remote controls Portable gaming devices

Smart home devices (thermostats, doorbells, security cameras)

Electronic toys

Laptops, tablets, cellphones and chargers

If residents are unable to properly dispose of used batteries right away, place tape over both ends while you store them. The tape prevents the battery from connecting and reacting with other batteries while you collect them for proper disposal.
