



See it...Report it...Remove it

We're looking to residents of Thorncliff to be good community partners too. While it sometimes takes a while, all reported graffiti is eventually cleaned up within two weeks, but it's very important to report it first by calling 311 or using the 311 app. Never clean graffiti unless you know it's been reported.

The longer graffiti stays up, the more it encourages the taggers to continue to hit our community so do your part and report it to 311 as soon as you see it, and send a photo if you can.

GREEN SHACK - Free Summer Program

It's back! From now and until August 24, the City of Edmonton is offering a FREE drop-in Green Shack Program. The program runs **Monday to Friday**, in Thorncliff Park supervised daily from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

The Green Shack program features popular summer playground programs, with a trained leader who engages the children in a variety of sports, games, arts, and crafts aimed at children age 6 to 12.

TCL and Victory Church on the Rock partner with The City of Edmonton each year by offering a free daily hot lunch program for all program participants. Safety Matters

It's summertime and the living is easy for thieves. Thorncliff has seen a spike in the number of thefts from vehicles. Remember: do not leave anything visible or valuable in your vehicle. LOCK THE DOORS! If you do get broken into or have something stolen report it to the police, no matter how minor.

Numerous break and enters have also been reported in the communities around Thorncliff this summer. In one reported incident thieves walked in the front door while residents were in their backyard. LOCK YOUR DOORS. Also, shut your garage door while you are in your yard and lock it when you not.

It takes less than a minute for a thief to walk into an open garage, grab something and walk out while you are nearby weeding or watering. Bicycles and tools are the favourite targets.

The Edmonton Police Service recommends that we join the #9PM Routine every night. It's easy! Every night at 9PM do a quick walk around your place and check that your vehicle(s), garage, sheds, windows, and doors are locked and put all valuables out of sight.

Common signs of stress

In tough times we can be more vulnerable to stress, worry, anxiety and depression. It's important to take care of ourselves. Tough times don't last. Tough people do.

At some point in our lives we all face tough times and we can be impacted directly or indirectly by such things as financial pressures or unexpected problems like what many Alberta farmers are facing with crop or livestock issues.

Remember, it's normal to feel stress from time to time in everyday life. Everyone who goes through stressful events can be affected in some way. Sometimes these stress reactions may not appear for weeks or months following an event. It is important to watch for warning signs.

The warning signs of stress can be physical or emotional. Some people call this "storing" stress in the body (physical) or in the mind (emotional).

Common physical symptoms of stress include:

- Rapid heartbeat.
- Headache.
- Stiff neck and/or tight shoulders.
- Backache.
- Rapid breathing.
- Sweating and sweaty palms.
- Upset stomach, nausea, or diarrhea.

You also may notice signs of stress in your thinking, behaviour, or mood. You may:

- Become irritable and intolerant of even minor disturbances.
- Feel irritated or frustrated, lose your temper more often, and yell at others for no reason.
- Feel jumpy or exhausted all the time.
- Find it hard to concentrate or focus on tasks.
- Worry too much about insignificant things.
- Doubt your ability to do things.
- Imagine negative, worrisome, or terrifying scenes.
- Feel you are missing opportunities because you cannot act quickly.

It's important to recognize signs of stress and know how to cope. Stress relief is different for each person. For some ideas to see which ones work for you visit: My Health Alberta at www.myhealth.alberta.ca and search managing stress.

Overdose prevention awareness

August 31 is International Overdose Awareness Day, a global event to raise awareness of overdose and reduce stigma of drug-related death.

In Alberta, opioid related overdoses are occurring at an alarming rate. Fortunately, many overdose deaths are preventable if medical help is given when you first begin to notice any symptoms.

Here are the signs of an opioid overdose:

- Their breathing is slow or they may not be breathing at all
- Body is very limp

- You can't wake them up
- Blue lips and nails
- Skin is cold and/or clammy
- Gurgling or snoring sounds
- Choking or throwing upPupils are tiny
- Seizures

If you come across someone or are with someone who may be overdosing, call 911 and, stay with them until we arrive. They may need your help while the ambulance is on its way. Due to the Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act people who experi-

ence or witness an overdose and who call 911 for help will receive some protection under the law.

While you wait for help, keep checking on them. Are they breathing? If not, begin rescue breathing. Are they responding or breathing on their own? If they are still unresponsive and you have naloxone – follow the step by step instructions and administer naloxone. Naloxone can temporarily reverse the symptoms of an opioid overdose.





Hospice, one of many options for end-of-life care

• emotional, psychological and spiritual support.

Before accessing palliative care or a hospice, a health care team discusses with patients on what's important to them and where they would like to be at the time of their illness where they may either have: a life expectancy of less than 3 months; signed a form saying they do not want to be resuscitated or a need to be in a bed or chair most of the time.

A patient's choice may change as an illness changes, and individuals can get palliative and end of life care at any time.

There's also a new program that's helping to bring emergency care to people who get pal-

liative and end of life care in their homes.

The EMS Assess, Treat, Refer program has Emergency Medical Services, home care clinicians, doctors, and families working together to help people stay in their homes if that's

what they wish.

Back to school safety



Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and students about some road safety tips, as streets become more congested, with the return of the school year. Pedestrians and motorists both have an important role to play – road safety is a shared responsibility.

Motorists

- Avoid talking on cell phones, texting, or any other behavior that diverts your attention away from driving;
- Give right-of-way to pedestrians who have activated overhead crossing lights, or who are waiting to cross from a street corner;
- Remember, it is illegal to pass vehicles - other than those that are parked - in school zones or playground zones, during posted hours

Around school buses

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is slowing down to stop – motorists should do likewise;
- No matter which direction you are coming from, STOP, when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights – unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you;
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.

Pedestrians

- Cross only at marked crosswalks, or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions;
- Make eye contact with all drivers before crossing the street, and keep distractions to a minimum;
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause before stepping off the curb to ensure motorists in both directions have come to a complete stoo:
- Stay within the crosswalk lines until fully clear of the roadway;
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the 'walk' sign and only when all cars have come to a complete stop;
- If you are with young children or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when crossing;
- Remember: children learn by observing. By demonstrating safe crossing habits, you can reduce the chances of your child being involved in a preventable auto/pedestrian collision.

How to talk to your children about drugs and gambling

Children are smart and they are learning all the time. You are the best person to show them how to make good decisions. The thought of your children using drugs may scare you, but your children will hear you better if you talk calmly.

Take time to learn the facts about different drugs and gambling. Tell your children the facts without sounding scared and without scaring them. You can show your children that they can trust the information you give them.

Things to Remember

• You start teaching children about drugs sooner than you think.

You have been teaching your children from the time they were very small. You have done this by telling them not to touch anything in the medicine cabinet, not letting them have adult drinks like coffee and beer, and telling them to stay away from cigarettes.

Start talks with your children by asking what they understand about drugs and alcohol, if they are concerned about anyone's use, or if they have been asked to use.

A drug can do a lot of good, or it can be harmful. If you take the right amount of medicine, you can get better. By taking too much, you can get very sick. Talk about this with your children. You can also talk about different kinds of drugs like medicine, legal drugs, and illegal drugs.

• Talk about gambling in a way that your children understand.

It's good to use real-life examples. Ask your children if they've ever made a bet with anyone about doing something that is hard or unsafe. An example might be betting a chocolate bar that someone couldn't walk along the top of a fence. Explain that this is a type of gambling. In this example, if the person takes the bet and walks on

the fence, he or she is at risk of getting hurt. The person betting may lose the chocolate bar. Both people are risking something they value, whether they know it or not.

Children gamble for fun and don't usually think of it as gambling. They usually call it betting or daring. If you use these types of words, it will be easier for them to understand what gambling is.

• Try to think of good examples. Have you seen a movie or read a book with someone in it who has a drug or gambling problem? Do your children have any examples to share? Talk about the people in the book or movie. Talk about their lives and the decisions they make. You can use this time to give your children good information. Keeping your children informed is the best way to help them make good decisions.
