A Kenilworth Senior's November to Remember

Kenilworth Community League has partnered with Heart to Home meals to provide KCL seniors in our community with two delicious frozen meals.

Due to COVID, we are limited in how we can engage with you, but we wanted to let you know we are thinking of you and want to help you out with a warm meal. If KCL can be of support to you please reach out to Loida.

How to Coexist with Coyotes in Your Neighbourhood

Coyotes are being observed in your neighbourhood. This is not a cause for alarm. Coyotes are commonly seen in natural areas and in residential neighbourhoods throughout the city.

You can do your part in keeping coyotes wild and decreasing coyote conflict by doing the following:

- Report any illegal dumping or excess litter and debris on public land to 311.
- Keep your property free of garbage, fallen tree fruit, pet food, pet waste and open compost.
- Pick up after your pet when off your property.
- Put garbage in a sealed bin and put it out only on your collection day.
- Supervise your pets on and off your property and prevent them from roaming free.
- Keep your pet on a leash in areas frequented by coyotes.
- Secure fences and prune overgrown vegetation on your property that could be used for coverage or be used as a potential den.
 - Never feed coyotes.

If you encounter a coyote, act aggressively towards it by using these techniques:

• Make loud noises (shouting, clapping,



etc.), maintain eye contact and make yourself appear large (wave arms overhead, hold big objects, etc.).

- Throw rocks, sticks, or other objects to scare it away.
- Carry a whistle, air horn or dog spray in areas highly frequented by coyotes.
- Do not turn away or run. This may trigger a natural predator/prey instinct and encourage the coyote to chase you. If the coyote approaches, back away slowly and move towards a building or human activity.

It is only necessary to report a coyote sighting when they have attacked a person or animal, if you see someone feeding coyotes or if a coyote is immobile due to injury or sickness. Greater Hardisty: Live, Learn and Play

The Greater Hardisty Community Sustainability Coalition is a grassroots citizen group from East Edmonton lending our time, talent and experience to ensure residents of this 1950's era area have a voice in its renewal, sustainability and future. As the area aged to maturity, its mix of commercial and residential properties gradually came into disrepair as vacant commercial properties emerged, and crime increased. Our volunteer members are passionate about rebuilding a new, functional, connected, and healthy community. Team members share professional expertise as pro-bono contributions to achieve our goals. We are interested bringing the business community together and diversifying housing stock. We welcome input as we move to implement of the 101 Ave corridor redevelopment.

We want to help build a better, sustainable street that is connected to our neighborhoods and used by our communities. We seek a place vibrant with commerce and social interaction, one that has the density to match. We're also collaborating on housing options and Social innovation ventures that will enhance urban wellness for all. Our vision is reflected in the City Plan as a Safe 'Vision Zero' Street that is welcoming, attractive, comfortable, and functional for all users in all seasons. Redevelopment potential includes rectifying the eight dangerous intersections along the avenue, creating an opportunity to introduce active mode infrastructure and transit orientated development, and build the elusive 'missing middle' format sorely needed in our mature neighborhood.

Continued funding for the avenue's planning and design concretely demonstrates the City Plan in action, and our team successfully lobbied City Council for this allocation by maintaining our commitment to the engagement

process, holding elected officials accountable, striving for the quality design and best practices we outlined in our feedback to the 101 Ave Corridor Study. In short, 101 Ave is an ideal location where we as community support creation of the denser urban form our city needs. We pointed to the city's own Market Housing and Affordability Study which confirmed how the area is one of 6 commercial nodes with the highest probability of sustaining urban density in the city. In consideration of our presentations, Administration suggested short term safety solutions while a motion to continue with \$2 Million of capital funding for planning and design work on 101 Avenue was approved by council. Although these temporary measures fall short of significantly advancing the vision we seek, when capital funding for the reconstruction and repaving of 101 Avenue does become available in a future budget cycle, the work now completed has a higher likelihood of proceeding in concert with complete street scape improvements designed to deliver on the extensive work and feedback already provided by the residents of Greater Hardisty.

By leveraging the worth of our #greaterhard-isty community engagement -- the citizen customer base we represent -- as a value-added asset to prospective developers, we are seeking a variety of partnerships to help build out the avenue as new suburban middle density complete street corridor node. We trust by reducing barriers for developers with secure community acceptance and cooperation ahead of development we will achieve our objectives. Capital City Clean Up

Capital City Clean Up is a litter reduction and graffiti prevention program developed to help keep the city clean, safe and attractive. I'm sure you've noticed the disposable gloves and facemasks contributing to the litter in our neighbourhoods, and if you're interested, you're welcome to help clean up the mess!

Each kit includes a safety guide, litter grabber, a pair of gloves, and a small and large garbage bag.

Due to the restrictions placed on group gatherings, we ask that people refrain from organizing litter clean-up events until restric-

tions are lifted. Instead, families and those living in the same household are encouraged to participate in this activity together, and are reminded to:

- Wear gloves
- Wash hands regularly with soap and water or hand sanitizer
- Disinfect the litter grabber or any other tool used before and after use, and store it in a safe location
- Secure and dispose of all litter and garbage bags in appropriate disposal locations
- Report needles, graffiti or other hazardous litter by calling 311



Christmas Celebrations Around the World

For a lot of kids in Canada, Christmas is a big holiday. There's no school, families put up trees and decorations, they eat lots of food, sing songs... and of course there's Santa and all the presents!

In different parts of the world though, Christmas often gets celebrated a bit differently.

Here are a few to mention:

SWEDEN - Candles on your Head

Christmas kicks off early in Sweden with Saint Lucia's Day on December 13. While Lucia is a Christian saint, the celebration is closely tied to the winter solstice – the shortest day of the year – and is seen as a celebration of light – and they go for light in a big way in this Swedish festival. Most towns and villages have a procession where kids dress up in white robes, with the girls carrying candles – often the electric ones until the kids are 12 – and the boys carrying wands with stars on the ends and pointy wizard-type hats. One girl is selected to be "Lucia" and this girl leads the procession wearing a crown of candles – usually real, lit-on-fire candles!

JAPAN - Romance and Fried Chicken

Christmas isn't an official holiday in Japan, but many people and businesses put up lights and trees. Young children get presents and the family will sit down for a meal of fried chicken instead of turkey. Christmas Eve is considered a very romantic time – like Valentine's Day in Canada. Couples will exchange gifts and go out for fancy dinners. Restaurants are usually booked months in advance for Christmas Eve.

AUSTRIALIA - Santa on the Beach

In Australia, December 25th is in their summer, so Christmas Day is a time to hit the beach.



There you might see surfers dressed up like Santa and Christmas trees set up on the sand. Christmas dinner is often made on the barbecue, and it's said that when visiting Australia, Santa gives his reindeer a rest and gets kangaroos to pull his sleigh!

VENEZUELA - Strap on those Roller Blades Venezuela is a religious country where most of the people are Catholic, so Christmastime involves a lot of going to church. In the capital city of Caracas, there's a tradition of closing the streets to cars on Christmas morning and people roller skate to church services.

SPAIN - The Christmas Log

Having a Yule log or a nice fire in the fireplace is a common tradition in lots of places, but in the part of Spain known as Catalonia, there's a different twist on that – the Christmas Log. This piece of wood is decorated with a face and a hat and wrapped in a blanket. Children pretend to feed it for most of December. Then on Christmas Eve, kids whack the log with a stick while singing a song. They remove the blanket to discover hidden candy and presents that the log is supposed to have "pooped" out! That's why the log is called Caga Tié(say "KA-ga tee-OH") – in Spanish that means Poo Log!




