

#### **Fulton Ravine South Park Update**

We are happy to announce that construction on the park will start this spring! Thank you so much to the community for your support of this project and to the community leagues for spreading the word.

With your help we've been able to get close to our fundraising goal. We made a slight adjustment in the choice of shade structure for the park to a more economical model than the one originally chosen, and with this adjustment and donations received in support of this project so far, we are in position to move ahead with all the components that are part of the plan design!

Signage and fencing will be going up onsite in mid-late May, with construction starting shortly thereafter. We've been advised that the skate park should be able to remain open during construction, although we expect that most of the rest of the park will be fenced off.



#### **New Features This Year-**

We're partnering with Find Edmonton to provide essential furnishings free of charge to individuals and families who are moving out of homelessness and supplying low-cost, quality furniture and housewares for sale to the public. Check the CCL social media platforms for details about what items are acceptable. Bring clean, useable, functional home furnishings that need another home rather than heading to the dump.

-We're partnering with the Edmonton Food Bank to collect clean dozen-sized egg cartons that the Edmonton Food Bank can use to repackage fresh eggs into their food hampers. The Edmonton Food Bank always needs these cartons, so this can be a year-round activity.

-The Cloverdale Toy and Book Swap is back for another year. Bring toys, books and games to the swap table and check out the 'new to you' items for you, your family and friends. This takes regifting to a whole new level.

-Mattresses: we'll accept mattresses this year for a fee. The CCL will see to it that the mattress gets to a City of Edmonton Eco Station for proper recycling for \$25/mattress. Payment via cash, cheque, e-transfer, or Square is required before the mattresses are accepted.

-Big Bin Event: nonhazardous, nontoxic household and yard material is acceptable.

#### Sustainability Efforts at the Hall Paying Dividends

There's more to the sustainability efforts at the Cloverdale Community League facilities than what meets the eye. In fact, most of our sustainability upgrades are behind the scenes. The extra insulation in the attic and crawlspace, high efficiency furnaces and other HVAC equipment are all hidden from view. What's visible are the energy efficient windows and doors and the LED lights in the hall and at the rink and the solar panels.

What's also visible is the impact these upgrades have had on the financial well-being of the Cloverdale Community League (CCL). The hall has been closed to the public for a year, so rental income has dried up completely. In fact, the CCL issued refunds for deposits on cancelled bookings. Despite the bleak revenue picture, we still had to keep the natural gas and electricity going to keep the hall and equipment safe.

However, there was a silver lining to these

There's more to the sustainability efforts the Cloverdale Community League faciliars than what meets the eye. In fact, most during these challenging times:

- Changes to the plumbing at the rink shack save about \$1800/year on our water bill.
- The 2020 gas bill was about 36% less that our costs in 2018 prior to the renovations.
- The new LED rink lights reduced the electricity bill by approximately \$150 in just three months of operations.
- Revenue generated by the solar panels to produce renewal electricity that is sold to the grid and used internally was almost \$4000 since August 2018.

The vision and leadership of the Cloverdale Community League's investment in energy

efficiency and renewable energy has helped us weather the financial storm we faced last year and are facing this year as well. These upgrades will continue to pay dividends in the future.

#### Tips to ensure a stress-free lab services appointment

Throughout the pandemic, extra safety precautions have been put in place to ensure all Albertans can safely receive lab services from Alberta Precision Laboratories (APL.) Immunocompromised patients and those requiring urgent testing should phone the province-wide Patient Appointment Line: 1-877-868-6848 for assistance.

Please proceed to www.albertaprecisionlabs. ca for information on locations, hours of operation and to book your lab test.

Safety Precautions At All Patient Collection Sites

Patients with appointments should not arrive more than five minutes prior to their scheduled appointment.

Walk-in patients may get requests from staff to help ensure safe distancing such as:

Being asked to wait in a nearby indoor loca-

tion or in your vehicle until space is available in the lab waiting area. You can choose to be notified by cell phone when you can enter the lab.

When wait times are long, patients may be asked to return at a later time.


All patients will be screened and assessed for COVID-19 symptoms and risk factors upon arriving at the lab site. Lab staff are required to wear all necessary personal protective equipment, in alignment with Alberta Health Services policies.

All patients will be provided with a new medical-grade mask to wear over their mouth and nose for the duration of their laboratory visit.

The number of chairs in waiting rooms has been reduced to provide proper distancing.

Additional cleaning and hand hygiene practices are in place at all facilities.

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#### Bicycle Helmet Safety



Head injuries are the leading cause of serious injury and death to kids on wheels\*. Most injuries occur when a cyclist suffers a fall, strikes a stationary object, or collides with another cyclist/pedestrian. Remember – it's the law in Alberta that cyclists under the age of 18 must wear a helmet (and highly recommended for all ages). Helmets should be CSA approved and worn during recreational activities such as skateboarding, in-line skating, and cycling.

#### Getting informed

- Wearing a helmet while cycling can prevent a serious injury, or even save a life;
- Brain injuries can cause permanent disability or death;
- Reduce your risk by always wearing your helmet;
- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash, even if it appears undamaged.

#### Getting started

- Allow children to assist when buying their helmet. Cyclists who choose their own helmet are more likely to wear them;
- Start the habit early. Young children learning to ride tricycles need to wear helmets;
- Parents must lead by example always wear a helmet when cycling.

#### Getting the right fit

- Take the time to properly fit and adjust your helmet to ensure maximum protection in case of a crash;
- When worn properly, helmets should fit level, not tilted up, or down over the forehead;
- Helmets should feel snug, but not too tight. To test the fit, the helmet should not fall off when you shake your head from side-to-side while the straps are unfastened;
- Adjust the chin straps to form a "Y" below and slightly forward from the ears;
- Only one finger should be able to fit under the chin strap when it is fastened;
- Do not forget to use the sizing pads included with the helmet. They will help improve the overall fit, comfort and safety.


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



- The civics portfolio and Holyrood Development Committee led by Dave and Jaime worked with countless developers in the area to ensure that our neighbourhood was consulted and our community was maintained. See their extensive report below for more info.
- Last but definitely not least, our new addition, Julie in the **secretary** role kept us all organized and in line throughout the year.

#### **Communications (Megan Wilson)**

What a crazy year we had, in 2020! Social media became pretty important in drawing together communities during a lot of uncertainty. Communications for Holyrood tried to focus on providing scientifically accurate information, links for mental health resources, as well as information about supporting local businesses, entertainment and local events. Our social media accounts are maintaining a consistent level of growth & engagement, with increases in followers on Instagram being our main gains for the year. Monthly contributions to the SEV and email newsletter response rates were tracked by the number of participants that were involved in community giveaways/ contests, it remains low but steady.

We collaborated with programs to deliver online and physical support for our community league events, like gingerbread house decorating, giveaways (paint for windows, prizes for contests), and the outdoor movie at the Big Bin

event for Community League Day (with assistance from Directors at Large and community volunteers). We also held a bottle drive with the proceeds going to the Food Bank, which was in addition to the donation made by the community league from the unused volunteer appreciation funds.

Other partnerships with the Holyrood En-Watch group and the Holyrood Cooperative Playschool saw successful online social media campaigns. The EnWatch group provided materials to be crafted into posts about crime prevention and information about emergency contacts. The Playschool required advertising for enrollment and for a new teacher. Both campaigns saw an increase in followers or responses to the call to action.

We launched a 'Magic Rock' scavenger hunt in 2020, and awarded prizes for the families who found all of the rocks. Instead of running a magic rock scavenger hunt this year, we will be directing the prizes to the community led Facebook Group #Holyroodrocks. This group popped up right around the same time as our scavenger hunt, and quickly became a hit with the families of Holyrood. It doesn't make sense to maintain our own initiative instead of working with the grassroots group that already has so many followers.

The social media feed from twitter was added to the homepage of the Holyrood Community League website, to increase our SEO. Semi-permanent information about Memberships, Programs and our Board of Directors were also added to the page. The articles on the left side of the page can be changed up in the future, according to need.

After a year of updating the outdoor sign, which is old and hard to use, I'm hoping to work with Sarah (the Facilities Director) this year to move forward with the project to replace the corner sign. This will be expedited by all the work that Past-President Wendy put into researching and costing out the project in 2019. Hopefully we can get this done in 2021.

#### **Programs (Kelly McRae-Seifert)**

The 2020-21 year has brought a lot of changes to Holyrood Programs. Most of the programs we traditionally run are still on hold due to Covid and space restrictions this year. We are working hard to get back to offering more programs by finding creative and innovative ways to connect as a community, even at a distance.

#### **City of Edmonton Community Programming**

Most city programs we normally are able to offer to our community members have been cancelled. These include our free community swim days, learn to skate and summer day camp programs. We hope to see these programs back running again in the near future.

We are especially excited after the cancellation of last year's Summer playground program (Green Shack) to receive the news this year that The City of Edmonton Summer playground program is working on its plans for the summer. The City will be following the direc-

tions given by the province and City Council and a final decision on how and if the summer playground programs will run will be finalized closer to the July start date. At this time, the city is planning for summer playground programs to run in some capacity, and Holyrood will be offering the regular half day summer playground program.

#### Holyrood Haul-Away - Community League Day

Holyrood Haul Away was held on September 19, 2020 in conjunction with Community League Day and an outdoor movie in the park. It was a busy day, hauling over 5 tonnes of junk out of the community, selling many memberships and giving a few away to new community members. The featured movies were Moana as a matinee and The Princess Bride in the evening, where the movies were displayed on massive screens on the field behind SEESA, across from our hall. There were prizes, cotton candy, plenty of hand sanitizer and physical distancing while working and playing with neighbours.

#### **Looking Forward**

Plan for the Holyrood Haul-Away again this year on community league day, September 18, 2021. Stay tuned for announcements on the festivities we will have going on this year.

#### Playschool

Holyrood Cooperative Playschool have had some major hurdles this year but have risen to the challenge and are on track to go for the 2021-22 school year. HCPS has now moved locations for the 2021/22 school year to Strathearn Community Hall.

The program is supported by a strong Parent Committee, who are working hard to maneuver the new and ever changing guidelines that are coming out regarding COVID-19 and safe teaching. Many thanks to this dedicated board of parents for making the playschool possible.

#### Soccer

After some uncertainty and a late start, the soccer program was able to run for the 2020 year. The Spring season started on July 13, with a decrease in players. Where there would have been about 130-140 young people playing, we had about 65 players. The season looked very different, and there were no tournaments, but the kids that wanted to play were able to get out and have a good time.

#### Caregiver Connections (Playgroup)

Our caregiver connection (playgroup) has not been able to resume yet. As soon as it is safe we want to continue with this casual gathering of caregivers and kids ages 0-5 for fun, learning and community support. Look for information in the fall for (if) where and when we will start meeting again.

#### To Note:

The position of playgroup coordinator is open for any interested care givers. Contact Programs at programs@holyroodcommunity. org if you are interested in supporting the community in this way.

#### **Events & Social**

Covid really threw a wrench in this year's social activities and events. We were able to plan a socially distanced Movie in the park on Community League Day (September 19, 2020) where we showed both a matinee (Moana) and an early evening movie (The Princess Bride). Telus sponsored us by providing cotton candy and the EFCL brought out some amazing prizes that were awarded to the attendees. Thank you to all of the volunteers who helped make Community League Day really great!

The rest of the social activities form this year included a magic rock scavenger hunt, gingerbread house decorating, working with the Holyrood Garden Committee on the Ice Garden in the park (which was AMAZING, by the way, thank you to everyone who made ice), and coordinating with our Abundant Communities Edmonton (ACE) representative to hand out free chalk at the playground. If you're interested in becoming an ACE block connector or neighbourhood representative, please contact communications@holyroodcommunity.org. It's a fun way to get to know your neighbours and requires a minimal time commitment.

We are still looking forward to 2021/22 and are hoping to be able to plan more events this year as more people are vaccinated. Now that we have a better handle on socially distancing outdoors, we've got some great plans in the works...does anybody miss music outdoors?

#### Facilities & Grounds (Sarah McDougall)

#### **Rink Repairs:**

Separate gas line independent of HCL building set up for rink shack. Gas was connected and turned on.

Rink shack now has an address independent of HCL building.

Some minor repairs with the washrooms still required. Since the rink shack was closed due to COVID 19, these were not a priority.

Rink shack roof will need a quotation for repair.

#### **General Rink Maintenance:**

**HCL** Hall Repairs:

An inspection of the HCL Hall was conducted in December, outlining maintenance issues big and small. We have budgeted for the majority of these repairs to be completed prior to the hall take over.

#### **General Hall Maintenance:**

Regular fire extinguisher inspections and fire safety system inspections.

Maintenance on main hall furnace completed

#### Other Grounds Items:

Drone photographs were taken of property on April 21 for sublicensing references.

Parking lot renewal project due to begin June. Removal of one tree was required.

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#### New Lease Framework with Holyrood After School Care

In 2018, the league made the decision to pursue a new type of lease arrangement with our hall's full-time tenants, the Holyrood After School Care Society (HASC). We continue to work on negotiating and drafting the lease, which will see HASC become the main occupiers, operators and administrators of 9411 Holyrood Road ("the hall"). We hope to have the new agreement in place soon.

The league will continue to operate our rink building at 9415 Holyrood Road, and that building will become our new base of operations. Work has been done to separate the utility services between the hall and the rink building.

#### **Rink Program**

The icemaker, Tyler Cheney, stayed on onboard. His ice making, attention to detail, and commitment to maintaining the rinks was great. Covid Protocols prevented us from running the rink shack and hiring rink attendants. The season was also limited this past year due both to Covid and the weather.

#### Memberships (Jessica Stone)

As of April 23 Holyrood's current membership is 104. The lack of permitted social events, playschool not running, the SEESA being closed, and COVID, the membership enrollment was lower than past years. The Big Bin/Movie event that was held in late September, was a great success with 38 memberships being sold. We look forward to higher membership numbers through the 2021-2022 year as things open up post-covid and we are able to run more events and programs.

**Holyrood Garden Committee (Jaime Forster)** 

The Holyrood Garden Committee is looking forward to the second season in our demonstration garden. In early 2020, the committee had a vision to take underutilized spaces beside the community hall and rick shack and transform them into a community food patch.

With support from our Neighborhood Resource Coordinator, Erin, the garden committee has been working toward our vision of building a permanent community garden in the neighbourhood. This includes a unique partnership between the Holyrood Community League, Southeast Edmonton Seniors Association and Holyrood After School Care Society. Unfortunately, the pandemic brought many challenges for these organizations, and the garden project was paused in 2020 to allow the committee to ensure all partners could fully participate in the planning process. Despite the challenges, we found a creative solution to maintain momentum for the project by creating a smaller "demonstration garden" in an existing, but underutilized space along their community hall and rink shack walkways. These beds were never finalized when the sidewalk renewal was done. so this provided an opportunity to finalize and beautify the green space while engaging with other gardeners who were interested in the long term project vision. NRC Erin helped to navigate the project and secure permission from the City. Residents were asked to donate pots. and a large metal trough for HCL programs was repurposed into a planter. Volunteers worked to weed and amend soil in the beds before planting a variety of flowers and vegetables. Although the space was not planted until the second week of June, we harvested and donated over 35 kilograms of produce to the Edmonton Food Bank in September.

This past year, Erin also helped the committee to complete the Strategic LED document and the public involvement plan in order to gain approval for the garden from the City. In early October we reached the Strategy Phase 1 checkpoint- which will allow us to move into the next phase; Concept and Design.

The HCG is looking forward to expanding gardening opportunities for the community in 2021. The committee will be meeting with all partners virtually in early May to regroup and map out the season. This year, we have had outreach from community members in regards to raised garden beds, and we hope to investigate this further. The Committee signed up for an associate membership to Sustainable Food Edmonton (SFE) and received a garden seed package that will be planted in this year's demonstration garden.

#### Civics & Holyrood Development Committee (Dave Sutherland)

The past year has both managed to drag on forever yet somehow also flew by us!

Our civics committee, the Holyrood Development Committee (HDC), had its hands full yet again with Holyrood Gardens; this massive redevelopment project has unfortunately managed to once again overshadow just about every other civics matter we hoped had to be more involved with over the past year - more so than even COVID. More details on that below.

Our community continues to grow and evolve along with the rest of the city. In addi-

tion to Holyrood Gardens, we've seen the start of another major apartment building in the heart of our neighbourhood, on top of numerous smaller infill projects. We do our best to reach out to and work with developers in our community to try to ensure their projects are the best they can be for our neighbourhood, while helping residents navigate development processes and addressing and directing questions, concerns, and issues about infill and more

After five years as Civics Director and Co-Chair of HDC, however, it's time for me to step down. I couldn't be more proud of the work HDC has done and all that we have accomplished together. I will remain on HDC as a member at least until the current Holyrood Gardens situation is resolved, but it's my hope to have someone else now step up into the role with their own perspectives and experiences. Jaime remains the Chair of HDC.

There's a lot of change still coming to the City of Edmonton, including the Zoning Bylaw Renewal, District Plan proposals, and so much more. Even within our community, more infill is coming, as rumour has it Golden Homes may also be seeking redevelopment.

Holyrood needs a strong leader and a strong team to be able to stay on top of these changes, and to be engaged in them on behalf of our League and its members to ensure the best outcomes for our community.

#### **Holyrood Gardens**



After a difficult and challenging rezoning in 2018, and construction having begun in earnest in 2020, Regency Developments is now back at City Planning seeking several zoning amendments that would see an increase from 1200 to 1650 units, increasing the size and height of one building, and increasing the widths of two of the towers, among others.

Our committee opposes many of the proposed changes on the basis that what was approved in 2018 already represented a major compromise between the needs of the City, the developer, and our community, and these changes seek to undo many of those compromises. Additionally, the Edmonton Design Committee (EDC) panned and rejected the

project's design twice, and we believe these proposed changes will only serve to deepen and amplify the project's flaws.

The proposed amendments go to Public Hearing on Tuesday, May 4. We are encouraging members to write to City Council with their concerns at city.clerk@edmonton.ca or fax to 780-497-8175 (or call 780-496-8178 for the mailing address).

Reference: May 4 public hearing, Item 3.25 Charter Bylaw 19681 - To allow for mixed use, high density, transit oriented development Holyrood. Anyone wishing to speak at the hearing can sign up at www.edmonton.ca/meetings, however we are encouraging letters instead to try to keep the length of the public hearing down.

#### Casino

Originally our Casino was scheduled to be June 2020 but due to covid was rescheduled to Nov 2020.

It went ahead as planned luckily and we received the funds in March 2021. A big thank you to all our volunteers!

#### 8302 95 Avenue

We are pleased to see this project, which HDC supported when it was being rezoned, now under construction. We believe the scale and design of this new building is appropriate for the location and will be beneficial to the neighbourhood. We look forward to welcoming new neighbours to our community!

Holyrood Court Apartments (NW corner of 95 Avenue & 79 Street)

PK Developments and Adrock Properties received approval to build 89 units in a new, four-storey building with underground parking, replacing greenspace between their existing four buildings.

We had reached out to the companies to try to learn more and possibly provide some feed-back ahead of getting their permits, however they were not forthcoming with communicating with us.

Several neighbours of this development did reach out to us with some questions and concerns, to which we were happy to provide some answers and guidance.

We did take a look at the plans with City Planning when their Development Permit was approved, and found no general concerns with the design. Again, we felt the scale and design are reasonable for the location, and will help fill an important need for more housing choices in our community especially near Holyrood School.

Valley Line LRT



TransEd has been working diligently to wrap up construction of the line over the past year, and work on Holyrood Stop as well as other nearby stops is now substantially complete. Testing on the line is expected to take place this summer, and revenue service is anticipated before the end of the year.

If you get a chance, take a walk around Holyrood Stop at 85 Street and 93 Avenue, and check out the photo art on the glass! The photos were taken by Holyrood residents - your outgoing Civics Director Dave Sutherland may have even contributed a photo or two!

#### Other Items

The owner of 9312 and 9320 83 Street reached out to us last year about rezoning the property from RF1 to RF5, to accommodate a five-unit row house development backing Holyrood Gardens and within a short walk to the new Valley Line LRT stop. HDC supported the rezoning as it represents a reasonable increase in density in a form that is compatible with the existing housing in the area. A Development Permit application is currently in progress.

#### **Vehicle Safety tips:**

Last I checked the crime stats for Kenilworth was 6 thefts from vehicles and 1 theft of vehicle in a 60-day period.

- Never leave insurance/ registration cards in the card
- Remove things like loose change, sunglasses, cigarettes etc from the car
  - ALWAYS lock car even if it is in the garage
- Consider having a "blinky light" installed. This is a light that blinks whenever the car is parked and is made to look like there is a security system in the car. This is a very inexpensive alternative to an actual security system for the car. I had a local company close to our community do it for me. I had it done at Bruce Stewart's Automotive on 76 avenue and 71 street
- EPS runs a "car curfew" program. It is free. You just contact EPS and register your car and you will be given a sticker to put on your car that will flag the police if the car is on the streets between 1AM and 5AM

#### **Health Corner: Rosacea Awareness**

Rosacea (say "roh-ZAY-shuh") is a common skin disease that affects people over the age of 30. It causes redness on your nose, cheeks, chin, and forehead. Some people get little bumps and pimples on the red parts of their faces. Rosacea can also cause burning and soreness in your eyes.

#### What are the symptoms?

People with rosacea may have:

A flushed, red face with sensitive, dry skin

that may burn or sting.

Small bumps and pimples or acne-like breakouts.

Skin that gets coarser and thicker, with a bumpy texture.

Dry, red, irritated eyes.

In rare cases, untreated rosacea may cause permanent thickening of the skin on your face or loss of vision. Most cases don't progress this far.

#### **Strathearn-based Business Profile**

Our spotlight series on local businesses connected this month with Leanne Heidenreich, of Dorothy's Appliance Centre Ltd.

How long has your shop been in Strathearn Centre, and why did you choose this location?

We moved here in 2016, initially drawn by the price of the rent. We love being in this location! The walk-in traffic is great for business, but most of all the neighbours and location is just wonderful.

What are some the most common items you repair, and can you tell us about some of the most unusual items you've worked on?

We regularly repair kitchen mixer machines, microwaves, lamps and cappuccino makers. I don't think there is anything too rare, we actually fix almost anything!

Inquiring minds want to know, who is the namesake of your shop, Dorothy?

My parents started this business in 1973 with another couple, Bud and Dorothy. They all put their names in a hat and drew hers out! They ended up only staying on with the business for about a year, but back then with all the signage and logos done my parents decided it would have been really expensive to change again, so the name just stuck.

In this day and age of so many disposable

gadgets, why would you say is it important to repair home appliances instead of throwing them out?

Often repairs to appliances are just something very simple. We take as much of the unfixable that we can to the ECO Station, and when we go the amount of good fixable appliances we see thrown away is just disgusting. The landfill is worse - I remember going with my Dad when I was young and we used to drive way down into the landfill. Now, we have to drive way up to the top of a great big hill. What is it going to be like when our grandkids are older?

Woohoo, LRT construction is almost finished! Now that the end is in sight, how do you think it will impact your shop?

I think the LRT will be great for all the businesses around it. It gives people a chance to move around the city to explore what it has to offer.

Anything else you'd like to share with your neighbours in Strathearn?

This is really a wonderful neighbourhood, and our little strip mall has a lot of different stores to check out. If ever you want to breathe new life into your small appliances, please give us a call or drop in!



#### **Cycling in Strathearn**

Does your bike need a tune up? Interested in learning more about cycling in Edmonton? We have good news for you!

On **Sunday, June 6th from 1-4pm**, right here in Strathearn, Bike Edmonton's volunteer mechanics will safety check and inspect your bike, and perform any needed adjustments. They can adjust the headset, wheels, brakes, shifters, saddle, and more; and do their best to solve your bike's mechanical issues. They carry a limited selection of parts like tubes and cables. If they don't have the parts your bike needs, their volunteers will let you know where you can find bike repair services in Edmonton. Following their health protocol, including wearing a mask, is mandatory and makes attending Bike Edmonton outreach events easy for everyone.

Then on the following **Sunday, June 13th from 1-3 pm**, join Bike Edmonton on an easy-paced urban bike ride through Strathearn and into Mill Creek ravine, exploring Edmonton's

dedicated bike infrastructure. We'll be cycling about 12 kilometers with lots of breaks, an accessible distance for many adults. Participants are to bring a fully tuned bike, extra clothing to suit the weather, and snacks and drinks they need. Participants will have to sign a waiver, including an agreement to adhere to Bike Edmonton's health protocol. Anyone under 18 has to wear a helmet and be accompanied by a parent or guardian who has signed their waiver and release.

More details on both of these events (including registrant sign up, if necessary) will be coming soon on strathearncl.org and our social media. Changing Covid conditions will determine the number of participants and may require changes to the format of events -- so mark your calendars and please stay tuned.
