Gardens Help Kids Grow With longer, warmer days in May, it's

a great time to begin a garden with your preschooler.

Whether you have a backyard patch of dirt, a few plant pots on a balcony or beside a kitchen window, or a small plot in a neighbourhood communal project, many of the benefits of gardening with your child are the same. You help your child grow along with the flowers and fruit, herbs, and veggies.

Digging, planting, weeding, and watering are all activities that help your child develop physically. As you both wait for seeds to germinate, flower, and produce fruit or vegetables, your child learns patience and develops emotional control. 



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
